KEY FINDINGS— AUSTRALIAN CAPITAL TERRITORY

National Wastewater Drug Monitoring Program—Report 16

The Program found that of the substances tested in December 2021 and February 2022 in the Australian Capital Territory:

- There was one capital city site monitored in the Australian Capital Territory in December 2021 and February 2022.
- Average alcohol consumption increased.
- Average nicotine consumption increased.
- Average methylamphetamine consumption increased.
- Average cocaine consumption increased.
- Average MDMA consumption increased.
- Average MDA excretion increased. Average excretion in February 2022 was the lowest on record.
- Average heroin consumption increased.
- Average oxycodone consumption increased.
- Average fentanyl consumption increased.
- Average cannabis consumption decreased.
- Average ketamine excretion increased.

National comparison—December 2021:

- The Australian Capital Territory had the second highest capital city consumption of heroin.
- The Australian Capital Territory had the second highest capital city consumption of oxycodone.
