Senate Order on entity contracts listing for 2022 calendar year

Pursuant to the Senate Order on non-corporate Commonwealth entity contracts, the Australian Criminal Intelligence Commission provides a list of procurement contracts entered into which provide for a consideration of \$100,000 or more and;

- have not been fully performed as at 31 December 2022 or
- have been entered into during the 12 months prior to 31 December 2022.

All procurement contracts required to be listed pursuant to the Senate Order can be found on the [AusTender](#) website.

Most of the contracts listed contain confidentiality provisions of a general nature that are designed to protect the confidential information of the parties that may be obtained or generated in carrying out the contract. The reasons for including such clauses include:

- ordinary commercial prudence that requires protection of trade secrets, proprietary information and the like; and/or
- protection of other Commonwealth material and personal information.

The accountable authority of the Australian Criminal Intelligence Commission has assured that the listed contracts do not contain any inappropriate confidentiality provisions.

The Australian Criminal Intelligence Commission has estimated its cost of complying with the Senate Order is \$1102. This is determined by calculating the time taken to collect, analyse and compile the information and applying salary costs and on-costs.
